

DETERMINING YOUR CHAPTER'S RUSH GOAL

- To determine your Chapter's rush goal, you must first decide what the ideal 'size' -- or number of members -- is for your chapter. It should at least be equal to the minimum requirement of your inter/national organization or the median size on campus, whichever is greater.)

Believe it or not, chapter size does overcome many of the problems of a chapter; that includes both manpower and money!

- Once you have determined the ideal chapter size, you must next determine how many new members it will take to reach that goal. All you need to do is follow this simple formula:
